NANCY DWYER, Cristinerose Gallery, 529 West 20th Street, (212) 206-0297 (through June 20). Ms. Dwyer is known for translating words into unlikely sculptural forms. Ceiling-high, multicolored columns are revealed by an accompanying diagram to spell out "um . . ." Encyclopedia volumes cut out to form the letters B, L, A or H are piled on a pedestal; a painting and a video show the letters tumbling through space. These things are amusing, but Ms. Dwyer has done cleverer transformations in the past (Johnson).
